On behalf of the Governors of Ysgol Derwen it gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report for the year 2017 - 18. It demonstrates yet again the excellent achievements and efforts of pupils, teaching and non-teaching staff and parents.

Pupil numbers remained constant rising to a total of 216 which included the part time Nursery Pupils. Our attendance figures were again good at 95.1% but for the second successive year the school failed to reach its attendance target owing mainly to parents taking children out of school during term time. This does have a negative impact on your child's education so please be aware of this when making your decisions.

The school was again placed in the Green Band , the first category according to the National Categorisation of Schools for the fifth year running. This is a tremendous achievement and our thanks must go to Mr Richard Jones and all the staff for their tremendously hard work in making this possible yet again.

The year proved a challenging one due to quite a few factors. Mr Jones was absent from school for a term due to ill health. We were very pleased to welcome him back after the Easter holiday. During this time, the school was very capably led by Mrs Suzanne King, the deputy headteacher, and our sincere thanks go out to her for her work during this time. Shortage in funding is also a very worrying and constant issue but all parents and carers can rest assured that whatever the circumstances, the high standards expected from all pupils have been achieved as can be seen in the report.

Once again, there was a wide range of sporting activities and clubs held throughout the year. The Governors would like to thank both staff and parents who give of their time to support the pupils and the school in so many ways. Without your dedication it would be impossible to give the children such a wide range of opportunities and challenges. Thank you all.

Our thanks also go to a small team of volunteers who come into school on a regular basis to give of their time and expertise to help both pupils and staff. It was also really heartening to note that a small band of parents have formed a new FODS committee to help raise much needed funds to help purchase resources for the school. Thank you all for your continued support.

Parents are welcome to use the Village Hall Car Park for the school run but


please do not to park in this area.
